

Tower Information

The Secretary sent out a letter or email to all tower correspondents towards the end of last year, giving the details that are held about them as tower correspondent, and of the bells and ringing at their tower. They were asked to check these details, amend as necessary and reply by the end of the year. So far, about half of the letters have been returned. If you have not yet done so, please return the letter, or reply to the email, even if everything is correct, so that we know that we have the correct details. We try to maintain accurate information. We can only do this with your help.

This has put the timetable back a few weeks but with a bit of careful planning, they hope to complete the job by the end of February.


So, by the time this issue is with you, Newport's ringing platform should be ready for us to move into.

Olney Update

As at the 9th February the appeal fund stands at just over £42,000 against a target of £57,600 and it is only a few days over three months since the appeal was launched. Earlier in January we held a Burns Night supper which raised over £1,000 for the fund and earlier this week Liz Sheaf, one of our ringers and Tina Jeffrey, a friend of the ringers, ran in the Olney Pancake Race sponsored for the fund and raised a little over £1,000.



On the grant side of things we have pending applications totalling £55,520 with the ODG Bell Fund, the Bucks Historic Churches Trust, the Foundation for Sport and the Arts and the Heritage Lottery Fund. The DAC Certificate

covering the new frame, retuning, casting of the new bells and the rehanging has been issued and the petition for faculty is being submitted next week.

The current plan is for work to start immediately after the last wedding we are ringing for this year on the 19th July and Whites of Appleton will be taking the bells out starting on the 18th August. We hope to be ringing the ten bells by the end of the year and are planning to ring for Service on Christmas Day.

We look forward to welcoming everyone to the AGM at Olney on the 1st March.

Grants

Applications for grants for assistance from individuals for training or from towers for work or for the provision of things that keep bells ringing shall be submitted to the Secretary. Details of applications received will be sent out to towers as soon as possible after receipt. All applications received and sent out at least one month before a meeting will be considered at the next general meeting of the Branch. A meeting for this may be convened at a Branch practice or other Branch event.

Training Grants

Grants will be given towards training courses as follows: 50% of the cost up to a maximum of £50. Applications for grants should be made in writing to the Secretary. It would help us if you apply before you attend the course if at all possible.

Officers Reports 2008

Chairman's Report

Improving communication with members without adding to the running costs of the Branch has been a regular part of our officers meeting during the year. We now have a way forward to communicate directly with every member of the Branch, once we have contact details for them. This should be starting to take effect during the coming year.

The Christmas celebration was again a great success with numbers up from the first year. The summer social also turned into an enjoyable afternoon with time to socialise as well as some ringing.

I would like to thank the other officers for their work. They are the people who make this Branch work, but without your support the Branch cannot flourish. I urge you to support the Branch events if you can. We also welcome your feedback on how we can improve things. Let us know what you think, the good, the bad and the ugly.

In some ways the Chairman now has an easier job than in previous years with fewer business meetings to run. This is my first ever time as Chairman of an organisation. I hope I have served you well and, if you wish, will be willing to continue for another year.

Secretary's Report

The new pattern of Branch practices and meetings continued during the year and average attendances continued to rise mainly due to the support for the striking competition and joint meetings with the Towcester Branch.

Membership of the Branch decreased by two in 2007, although 19 new members were elected. This was entirely due to the whole of one tower not renewing their subscriptions. There are now 27 towers in the Branch with members.

The Officers have met on five occasions during the year to deal with the business of running the Branch. Between meetings informal discussions have taken place by e-mail.

As part of the usual preparations for the Annual Report, tower information sheets were again sent out to all towers for which we have contact details, requesting that they check these details and correct any mistakes. The rate of return is about 50 per cent, much the same as in previous years. If your tower has not yet returned the sheet, please do so, even if the details are correct. That way I can ensure that the Branch records are kept up to date another year.

Ringing Master's Report

I am pleased to report quite a successful year. We have had many useful Branch practices where a variety of methods have been rung and all the basic requirements fulfilled. Generally attendance has been good on the whole. The Six bell striking competition was exceptionally well attended and I was pleased to see the band from Olney in attendance as well. There was a good performance at the Guild competition also. At the Eight bell competition we provided two teams and both gave good performances. At the Inter-Branch competition with Towcester Branch we saw 22 ringers represent North Bucks and I was proud of our performance. The Ten bell competition provided the opportunity for some very useful practices; an excellent quarter peal of Stedman Caters was rung at Long Crendon and a very good attempt at All Saints, Northampton. Unfortunately on the day we could not raise more than eight ringers.

Training Officer's Report

This year has been very quiet. There was only one course run which was calling Stedman Triples, thanks to all those who helped on this course. There were two courses asked for, Calling Stedman Doubles and Calling Called Changes. Yet when advertised there were no takers (not even from those who had asked for the course). I have also put articles in virtually all *In Touch* magazines, asking for people to contact me if they would like a

course. There were no responses. I personally do not feel that there is a need in this Branch for a Training Officer at this time.

Guild Representatives' Report

The two meetings of the Guild Year (March and November) have both been attended by either Brian or Alan or indeed by both of us. In March with the two of us, a Guild Steward and a Guild Steward-in-Waiting, we were probably the best represented Branch in attendance!

The March meeting is pretty much about preparing for a smooth AGM in May. However, there can be moments of excitement to draw you from your slumbers post liquid lunch. We had an interesting debate about the Guild Gazetteer - the CD of Guild tower information. This has been much debated in the past and broadly two schools of thought prevailed, those who backed it want it to continue in its current form and others who see it as a substantial duplication of the contents of the Dove On Line database which is destined to be the National Bell Register. Things got a bit personal (as they can do) and the meeting did not really get off the fence, so left matters to November.

The positive action from March was the progression of the Communication sub group (another committee to you and me). The meeting agreed its creation was a positive move towards the Guild identifying more with its members (and vice-versa) and from the overwhelming response to the Guild Festival when members were individually invited, felt only good could come from this initiative.

The impact on the Guild and Branches of the changes to Capital Gains Tax was again explained to the meeting. I wonder just how do Branches justify having so much money as to be liable to pay tax on the interest, yet still have unringable bells??

The November meeting was possibly less exciting, but the lunch time beer was definitely better! There were no changes proposed to subs or peal fees, although after the meeting there were mutterings that perhaps they are too low - even if the Guild does not seem to need the money just now.

Notice of the imminent transfer of Linslade from the Guild and Diocese was given. Linslade joined the St Albans Diocese and the Beds Association at the beginning of February 2008.

Communication and the output of the sub group had been circulated and proposal for a central database of all members' contact details that will be routinely validated by Branches was met with great support. It was agreed to vote money for servers and web thingies that most of us don't understand but sound like they might work. The Guild website may be re-located away from that of the Diocese of Oxford and a strategy for linking Branch sites to the Guild site will be developed.

The Gazetteer was discussed and it will be updated one more time and then laid to rest in a suitable site on the internet.

Archivist's Report

The Branch Archivist's activities are a combination of basic information gathering and the development of the presentation of that information. The Archive is intended as a resource for all Branch towers and members. It is an ongoing research project that continually adds to our knowledge of the history of ringing in North Bucks. The research is not only paper based. Measuring bells and bell frames and photographing towers during building work are an important part of recording our history. The long term aims of the project are to:

- Create a full written account of ringing in North Bucks
- Create a full record of the bells an update to, and building on Church Bells of Bucks.

During the last year, the Archive has gained more photos, more sound files and more from the local papers. The website now has some new pages including a bar chart of membership numbers for each tower. The collection of Ringing Worlds from Bletchley, along with a number of other interesting items, are also now included. Almost anything is worthy of inclusion. So if your tower has anything of interest that isn't in the Archive, let me know. In return, I can do something to raise awareness locally by presenting what we know about your bells to your Church members or local historical society.
