Happy 90th Birthday to Derek Stainsby of Loughton

Derek is the former tower captain of All Saints, Loughton and St Mary's, Shenley and has been a member of the North Bucks Branch since 1974. He has been an active and highly valued member, acting as Guild Rep from 1976-81, Assistant Ringing Master 1978-79, and Branch Ringing Master from 1981-88.

Derek was born on the 22nd January 1930 in Deeping St Nicholas, Lincolnshire, the twin son of a minister. He and his brother David learned to ring in 1943 (one of the '43ers') at Edenham in Lincolnshire.

He met Anne Amor, a fellow ringer at a ringing meeting at St Pauls, in Bedford and they were married in December 1959 at Anne's parish church, Christ Church Bedford, one of the few churches in Bedford with no bells so the guard of honour rang hand bells. After living and ringing in Radcliffe-on-Trent, Derek and Anne and their three sons moved to Milton Keynes in 1970 where Derek worked on the development of the new city of Milton Keynes. As tower captain of Shenley, Loughton and Bradwell, he ran excellent practices which attracted many visiting ringers who not only enjoyed the advanced ringing but also the company – Derek is never short of a tale to tell or an amusing comment on shoddy ringing! Derek was a regular Sunday service ringer at Shenley and Loughton when services permitted and, though no longer ringing, is still to be seen in All Saints ringing room on Sundays for a chat – and even rang briefly for the Christmas service last month.

The recent refurbishment of Loughton bells was a project he took a particular interest in, and his generous donation helped kickstart the project and funded the new treble bell which was dedicated to Derek and Anne Stainsby.

Derek has taught innumerable people to ring – many still ringing in the branch – and his patience and good humour along with his support and encouragement ensured progress beyond the new ringer's expectations. With Anne alongside him, he was happy to take the time with extra coaching, visits to other towers and organising quarter peals.

Derek has rung 14 peals for the branch and 124 quarters. His first quarter for the branch was in September 1971 at Bletchley with his first peal for the branch following in December 1972 (both Plain Bob Major and both also having Terry Page in the band). Derek was also a member of the band that rang a peal in 1979 for the 75th Anniversary of the North Bucks Branch. A particularly special quarter peal was rung on 22nd January 1995 when both Derek and his brother David rang at Loughton to celebrate their 65th birthdays that day.

Derek and Anne were made Life Members of the ODG in 2008.

Derek still keeps abreast of branch activities through the branch newsletter "In Touch" and still reads the Ringing World, a magazine he has subscribed to for around 50 years.



2020 Leap Year Sponsored Ringing

The Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund AGM celebrated its 45th anniversary in September 2019.

Since its inception it has been able to assist bell restoration in the Diocese by granting over £400,000 to more than 200 projects. Better still because it is a capital fund, all the money that has been raised is still invested and the grants have been paid from interest and dividends generated by the capital,

Every year there are activities, which generate new money for which the Trustees are very grateful as only by increasing the capital can the Fund keep pace with rising costs, We are keen to ensure the 2020 Leap Year Sponsored Ringing Event, is a resounding success.

First organised in 1979 when Branches were encouraged to organise a sponsored Peal or Quarter Peal and donate the money raised to the Bell Fund. A special Shield was provided by Bill Butler and inscribed by Ted Gosling for presentation to the Branch raising the largest amount of money. Bicester Branch won, raising over £231. We don't expect peals and quarters (but by all means ring them if you like), any ringing can be sponsored, so presents a great opportunity to involve all levels and abilities and to introduce new members to the work of the Bell Fund.

In 2020 the Sponsored Ringing "Week" will be the 22nd to 29th February, The Shield will be presented to the Branch raising the greatest amount per head of membership. Sponsorship money can be Gift Aided to benefit from recovery of Income Tax.

Merger of ODG Restoration Fund with the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund

The idea of exploring a merger of the two Funds was raised back in November 2018 and the matter was debated at the Spring meeting of the ODG and subsequently by discussions and emails.

It is well known that for many years the Restoration Fund has been poorly supported compared to the Bell Fund. The idea of a possible merger was not only to simplify the administration and accounting but more importantly to remove the confusion between the two and enable fund raising to be focus on just one Fund.

Although the objects of both Funds were essentially the same there were two key differences. Firstly, the Bell Fund did not support augmentation work whereas the Restoration Fund did. Secondly, the Bell Fund is a Capital Fund i.e. all the money raised is invested with the interest and dividends from those investments being put into the grant fund for projects. In the case of the Restoration Fund the grant fund was derived any money raised plus interest, which has been minimal for several years. Due to the poor support the grant fund has never been significant in value.

The two funds were registered charities and following the discussions the trustees of both agreed resolutions for a merger having agreed the details on how a merger would work. The resolution for the Restoration Fund was passed at the AGM of the Oxford Diocesan Guild in May 2019 and the Bell Fund resolution was passed at an EGM in November 2019.

The merger was registered with the Charities Commission in December 2019 and was subsequently confirmed with a date of the 31st December 2019. The merger means that the Restoration Fund has been wound up with all assets being transferred to the Bell Fund.

The matter of the Bell Fund not supporting augmentations was resolved with a rule change at the EGM in November 2019. This will enable the Bell Fund to support grant requests that would have been directed at the Restoration Fund in the past.

As part of the merger process it was agreed that the unrestricted assets of the Restoration Fund would be transferred to the grant fund of the Bell Fund but any money required to support outstanding grants would be ring fenced. Furthermore, the restricted fund for the Longworth restoration project would become a restricted fund in the Bell Fund along with its assets.

As agreed with independent examiner the transfer of assets will appear on the balance sheet of the Bell Fund in 2020. The Charities Commission does not require a financial return to be filed for 2019 as the Restoration Fund was officially wound up on the 31st December.

The Trustees would like to thank the individuals, towers and the Branches for the financial support given over the years to the Restoration Fund and for all the support received during this merger process. The nett result of this merger should enable the Bell Fund to better support the restoration and maintenance of the bells in the Diocese of Oxford.
